In Autumn 2016, FRC received the news that a new project had been approved by the European Commission under the framework of the Erasmus+

[EduLaw \(ELA\) on the introduction of educational modules regulations in teacher education](#) started in January 2017 and will run for three years, with the possibility of a one year extension, and is funded by a European grant of 943,663.00 euros.
