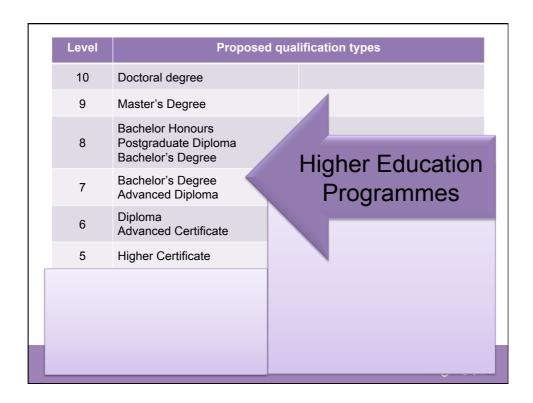




#### **Qualification Framework**

 In South Africa, the National Qualification Framework (2007) provide for 10 levels of qualifications





#### **Qualification Framework**

- In South Africa, the *National Qualification Framework* (2007) provide for 10 levels of qualifications
  - Higher Education Qualification Sub-framework (HEQSF) (2014) – post-school - top 5 on the NQF
- Short Learning Programmes (SLPs) fall outside these



#### **Teacher Education Qualifications**

- Minimum Requirements for Teacher Education Qualifications (MRTEQ) (2015)
- Identifies three broad qualification pathways that educators may follow with a view to advancing their careers
  - a teaching and learning pathway,
  - a management and leadership pathway
  - an educational planning, research and/or policy development pathway.
- Education Law relates mainly to the second and third



#### **Teacher Education Programmes**

- Initial Teacher Education (ITE) curricula are packed
  - Bachelor of Education degree Minimum 480 credits over 4 years (often overloaded to 520-580)
  - 10 Notional Hours per credit
  - Purpose: specialise as a beginner teacher in a specific phase and/or subject.



#### Explanation of the problem

- In the ITE programmes, limited EduLaw content, if any
- After teaching for a number of years career pathway change to
  - management and leadership pathway
  - educational planning, research and/or policy development pathway
- Do not have the theoretical grounding to continue with postgraduate studies in EduLaw
- Policy suggest qualification pathway to support:



# Example of qualification pathway

- Initial qualification (B Ed or B degree + PGCE (L7))
- 1st post-initial professional qualification (Adv Cert in School Management and Leadership (L6))
- 2<sup>nd</sup> post-initial professional qualification (Adv Diploma in School Management and Leadership (L7) or Adv diploma in Education System Management (L7))
- 3<sup>rd</sup> post-initial professional qualification (PGDip (L8))
- 4<sup>th</sup> post-initial professional qualification (M Ed (L9))



#### Explanation of the problem

- Currently limited number of HEIs have rolled out Adv Cert (L6) in School Leadership
- Adv Dip (L7) still in the pipeline
- Currently students are enrolling for PGDip or Hons without any L7 Law qualification
- Challenge to present EduLaw modules on the correct level – level descriptors



### **Short Learning Programmes**

- Fall outside formal programmes
  - regarded as non-formal learning
  - not on a particular NQF level, but can be developed with the level descriptors in mind
- SLPs
  - Attendance based or
  - Competency based



# A good practice guide for the quality management of SLPs offered outside of the HEQSF

- Do not lead to qualifications or part qualifications on the HEQSF
- Serve different developmental purposes
- Offered outside the realms of the HEQSF
- Flexible, 'just-in-time' and 'just-enough' learning to meet specific needs
  - improve or up-date participants' knowledge and skills in a particular field
  - impart new knowledge and competencies
  - facilitate adoption of innovation and change; and provide for personal or professional development



# To overcome the gap in terms of EduLaw on level 8 we propose

- Competency based online SLPs on EduLaw
- Prerequisite for level 8 qualifications:
  - to successfully complete specific SLPs prior to enrolment
- Also stand-alone SLPs for staff development without pursuing further qualifications



# Proposed design

- · Learning in own time and speed
- Prior informal learning will be useful
- · Online assessment
- Online support provided
